From the Principal's Desk



Since its inception D.A.V. Centenary College has spared no effort to establish and maintain high standards of all-round excellence and impart values espoused and cherished by the D.A.V. movement so that our students go out into the world as confident, awakened, morally sound and well-rounded beings armed with sufficient general as well as specialized knowledge not only to successfully make their way through the maze of today's complex and rather formidable world but also to work for the larger good of society and humanity. The college has never lagged behind in innovating with and moulding traditional courses so that our young men and women face no problem in successfully and painlessly adapting themselves to the rapidly changing socioeconomic and technological environment in today's globalised world. That the pursuit of serious, diversified and multidimensional

academic activity which is at the same time job-oriented and in sync with the times is always on the top of our agenda is further borne out by the fact that, apart from traditional UG and PG Courses like B.Sc., B.Com., B.Com.(Hons), B.A., M.A. (English), M.Sc.(Computer Science) & M.Com., the college is running a string of a professional courses like BBA, BBA(CAM), BCA and Bachelor of Tourism & Travel Management and vocational courses like B.Com.(CA), B.Com.(TPP), B.A.(Marketing)and B.A.(Journalism and Mass Communication). And five years ago we started Add On Courses like Computer Graphics, Animation Multimedia and Web Designing, Oracle9: DBA and Computer Hardware Networking and Ethical Hacking. The college also has a state-of-the-art Language Lab so that our students can acquire greater linguistic skills. And this earnest quest of ours has translated into our students' consistently good showing in the university examinations through the years. Academic activity, being on the top of our agenda, includes serious classroom teaching round the year, extension lectures, talks, workshops, seminars and conferences including State Level Events and National and International Conferences, Seminars and Conclaves. For instance, during the last four years the college has hosted four International and two National Conferences with a National Conference on Globalization and Sustainable Growth of Business organized by the P.G. Department of Commerce held during the just-concluded session. Also, with its focus on research, the college is at the moment publishing four refereed research journals. At the same time, with a view to promoting sound and creative thinking and writing skills among our students and the faculty, the college is now bringing out two magazines apart from the college magazine 'Shatabdi Pratigya'. But along with academics, sports and other extracurricular activities are our strong points and have always been vigorously promoted for the wholesome growth of our

wards with consistently excellent results even at the National and International Level. Improving the overall ambience of the institution and providing the best possible facilities is high on our agenda. To this end, the Library Complex and the Computer Labs have been upgraded, revamped and expanded at considerable cost and the process is still on. In the same vein, smart classes have been set up and more such classes are in the process of being set up to minimize the chalk and talk method. A much needed two storey new building block came up a few years ago at a cost of Rs.3.5 crore to add to the already impressive and sprawling college buildings. It consists of 32 well-appointed classrooms, state-of-the-art computer labs with the latest software and hardware and a big sound –proof and airconditioned hall in the basement with a high quality sound system and acoustics which is now being extensively used for college activities and function as well as for big ticket event like International Film Festivals and Theatre Festivals. There are departmental libraries and a well-equipped Health Centre with a full time Medical Officer. An impressive Yajna Shala is there where regular Havan Yajnas are performed and discourses given for the spiritual uplift of the students and the faculty. The spiritual quotient of the students and the faculty is further taken care of by organizing discourses by spiritually elevated souls, spiritual courses as well as discussion and bhajan sessions even on Sundays and other holidays. The aesthetically landscaped and painstakingly maintained and manicured lawns, with hundreds of potted plants and trees dotting the campus and a riot of colour in the form of thousand of flowers, further enrich its ambience. All steps have been taken to augment water supply and provide adequate power back-up. The college website is now very much operational so as to make all the important information related to the college available to the students and their parents/guardians at the click of a mouse. Also the system of online admission and online payment of fee is very much in place. At the same time all possible steps are taken to maintain discipline in the campus. To further improve the overall security environment, CCTV cameras have been installed at strategic places in the campus and constant vigil is maintained to prevent any untoward incident. The persistent focus of the college on overall quality maintenance and improvement was rewarded by the Peer Team from NAAC accrediting our institution with ‘A’ Grade in November , 2015. Since I took over a little more than eleven years ago, I have made an earnest attempt to impart a new dynamism to the all-round growth of the college and am committed to carrying forward this process so that this institution becomes a role model in the university and the region. My efforts, in tandem with the good work put in by our competent and dedicated staff, are already showing excellent results. And we are determined to continue the good work.

- ❑ By virtue of the dedicated and persistent efforts of the College Placement Cell, 180 students found placement in a number of prestigious companies like GENPACT, Infosys, ICICI Bank, Tech Mahindra, AEGIS, Policy Bazar, Religare Securities and Sony etc. during the year while placement of more students of that session is still going on.
- ❑ The Department of Marketing brought out during the year Volume V, Issues I & II, of its in-house journal DAVCC'S Advance Management Research: An International Journal.
- ❑ The College has also brought out during the year the third issue of one more refereed research journal, namely Perianth: A Refereed Research Journal of Humanities and Social Sciences.
- ❑ Various Senior Faculty members of our college were invited as Resource Persons and Chaired Technical Sessions of several National Conferences and Seminars during the year.
- ❑ The Post Graduate Department of Commerce and the Department of Marketing organized a 2 Day DHE, Haryana, sponsored National Conference on Globalization and Sustainable Growth of Business in February this year with rich participation of eminent resource persons and paper presenters from all over the country.
- ❑ Before that the above Department also organized a National Level Lecture Series on Commerce, Management and Economics in October 2016. Well-known experts from these varied fields delivered as many as 5 highly illuminating and educative lectures on the occasion.
- ❑ The Geography Model prepared by our students won the First Prize and the Chemistry and Computer Science Models the Third Prize in the State Level Science Exhibition organized under the auspices of the Directorate General of Higher Education, Haryana. Before that the Computer Science, Chemistry

and Geography Models prepared by our students won the First Prize and the Physics Model the Second prize in the Inter-District Level Science Exhibition. Another noteworthy fact is that both the above Exhibitions were hosted by the college this year and the superb arrangements made by the college won all-round applause.

- ❑ Our bright EMA students cornered glory by lifting for the 9th time in a row the Overall Championship Trophy with a Cash Prize of Rs. 51,000/- and 14 First Prizes in the Zonal Youth Festival and the Overall Runners Up Trophy with a Cash Prize of Rs. 31,000/- and 4 First Prizes in the Inter-Zonal Youth Festival. And one of them went on to participate in the South Asian Universities Youth Festival in the Music Section.
- ❑ Following the parallel government track, our highly talented and committed EMA students went on to win the First Prize in One Act Play at the National Level Youth Festival, organized by the Government of India, along with a Cash prize of Rs. 6 lakh after winning the First prize at the State Level Youth festival with a Cash Prize of Rs. 1.20 Lakh.
- ❑ The College Sports also went from strength to strength with twenty of our students participating in International Tournaments and Championships in Sports ranging from Badminton, Rowing, Canoeing and Roll Ball to Yoga, Taekwondo and American Football .
- ❑ As for National Championships and Tournaments, our students won as many as 18 gold, 23 silver and 18 bronze medals in diverse sports like Rowing, Canoeing, Cricket, Badminton, American Football and Wushu. As many as 150 students participated in the National Sports Events.
- ❑ It is a matter of immense pride that two of our students were awarded a Cash Prize of Rs. 3 lakh each for winning gold in the National Skating Championship and for participating in the International Skating Championship. They received the above Cash Prize from His Excellency the Governor of Haryana and from

the Hon'ble Chief Minister of the State.

- ❑ In the State Level Tournaments and Championships, our students bagged 70 gold, 24 silver and 11 bronze medals, making the college proud of their excellent performance.
- ❑ The college has lifted as many as 7 Inter-Zonal Sports Championships of the university this year, 5 in Men's Events and 2 in Women's Events.
- ❑ In the sports arena, another feather in the cap of the college was that it not only hosted the Inter-College Zonal and Inter-Zonal Volleyball (Men) Tournaments of the University in the months of September and October respectively but also that our college team won both the Tournaments.
- ❑ The college also hosted the Inter-College Zonal Men's Cricket Tournament in October 2016. Once again, our team won the Tournament.
- ❑ As for NCC Boys' Wing, 2 cadets attended the RD Camp and took part in the Republic Day March Past at Rajpath. Both of them were honored for this feat by His Excellency the Governor of Haryana.
- ❑ 2 cadets attended the Ship Attachment Camp in Mumbai. One of them also attended the National Integration Camp at Hyderabad as well as the Advanced Leadership Camp in Mumbai and was declared the Best Cadet in the latter Camp.
- ❑ 1 Cadet attended the Nau Sainik Camp at Karwar, Karnataka.
- ❑ As for the NCC Girls' Wing, 2 of our Cadets represented the Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Directorate in the All India Nau Sainik Camp at Karwar. One of them won the gold medal there in the subject of Health and Hygiene.
- ❑ 2 Cadets of the Girls' Wing attended the Annual Training Camp at Ezimalla, Kerala.

- ❑ All the Cadets of the Girls' Wing attended the Annual Training Camp held at Damdama Lake, Sohna.
- ❑ The NCC Boys and Girls Units of the college got together to celebrate the International Yoga Day on 21st June last year on the college campus in which more than a thousand NCC Cadets from all over Faridabad participated, making the above celebration a grand success.
- ❑ Apart from organizing a 7 Day Camp held in the Govt. Primary School of Rahul Colony, a poorer area in the neighbourhood of the college, and 3 One Day Camps in the College, the NSS Boys' Unit joined hands with the NSS Girls' Unit, the College Youth Club, the College Youth Red Cross Units (Boys and Girls), the College NCC Units (Boys and Girls) and the Lions Club Surya to organize Two Blood Donation Camps in the College, one in October 2016 and the other in April this year, wherein a total of 371 units of blood were donated.
- ❑ The College NSS Girls' Unit also organized a 7 Day Camp in which, apart from other activities, the volunteers also visited a local Gaushala and a school for underprivileged children. During the Camp, a Yoga Session was organised for their physical and spiritual rejuvenation, they took out a Rally to generate awareness about traffic rules and also took part in a Cleanliness Drive to drive home the message of keeping the environment clean.
- ❑ The NSS Girls' Unit also took out a Rally on the International Peace Day and celebrated the International Youth Day by organising different events to mark the power of the youth.
- ❑ Two of our Youth Red Cross volunteers were selected for attending the M.D. University Summer Camp at Mussoorie last June. Also the College Youth Red Cross (Boys' Unit) Counsellor was selected by the university as the Counsellor In charge of the above Camp.
- ❑ In the month of September , 5 Youth Red Cross volunteers alongwith the College YRC (Boys' Unit) Counsellor attended the 7 day State Youth Red Cross

Camp at Mansa Devi Temple Complex, Panchkula. Out of 33 Counsellors from 9 universities of Haryana, our College YRC Counsellor was selected as the Best Haryana State YRC Counsellor. It was a repeat honor as he had been honored with the same trophy and rank in the 2014 Camp as well.

- ❑ In the same month, His Excellency the Governor of Haryana honored the College YRC (Boys' Unit) Counsellor with a Silver Medal and a Certificate of Appreciation for his service to humanity and society for the last 30 years.
- ❑ Our College YRC (Boys' Unit) Counsellor attended the 1 Day Health and Hygiene Camp in M.D. University , Rohtak, alongwith 12 YRC volunteers. - ❑ The College YRC Unit conducted a 5 Day First Aid and Home Nursing Camp in the College in March this year. The Camp was attended by 104 students, both boys and girls. It was inaugurated by the District Secretary, Red Cross .
- ❑ Our College YRC Unit conducted 2 day Professional Training Camp on First Aid and Home Nursing in April this year . The expenditure on account of the Camp was borne by the Indian Red Cross Society, Haryana State Branch, Chandigarh. 30 College YRC volunteers were trained free of cost during the Camp.
- ❑ The College Red Ribbon Club and the Youth Red Cross Unit organised a 1 Day Workshop on HIV/AIDS in which the Keynote Speaker was Dr. Veena Shama, Deputy CMO, B.K. Hospital, Faridabad.
- ❑ Our College, as per the directions of the DHE, Haryana, and the Haryana AIDS Control Society, organised for 15 days various programs to spread awareness about HIV/AIDS. A Rally, a Workshop and various other in-house programs like Declamation, Slogan Writing, Drawing/Painting and Poetic Recitation

were organised during that period.

- ❑ In January this year, as per the directions of the DHE, Haryana, and the AIDS Control Society, Haryana, a 15 Day Awareness Campaign, related to the problems, challenges and diseases facing the youth, was organised. - ❑ In April this year, a Mega Health Check-Up Program was organised under the aegis of the College Red Ribbon Club and the Youth Red Cross Unit in which the College students underwent a Health Check Up by specialist doctors from the Sarvodaya and Metro Hospitals. A total of 920 youth and staff enrolled for the above check-up.
- ❑ 5 volunteers from our College YRC Unit attended the 5 Day District Health and Hygiene Camp held in Aggarwal College, Ballabgarh.
- ❑ Our YRC Counsellor also attended a 3 Day Brigade Officers' Training Camp at Panchkula organised by the Indian Red Cross Society, Haryana State Branch.
- ❑ The College YRC (Boys' and Girls' Units) joined hands with the College NSS Units to take out a successful Rally on 31st May this year to mark the International Anti -Tobacco Day.
- ❑ Representing the College Legal Literacy Cell, our students won 8 prizes including 4 First Prizes at the District Level Competition, 3 First Prizes, in Power Point Presentation, Debate and On the Spot Painting respectively, 2 Second Prizes, one in Debate and other in Poetic Recitation, and 2 Third Prizes, one in Slogan Writing and the other in On the Spot Painting at the Division Level Competition and further on won the First Prize (in Slogan Writing) at the State Level Competition organized under the auspices of the Haryana Legal Service Authority and the office of the DHE, Haryana.
- ❑ The College Legal Literacy Cell also sent students to participate in the District

Krishan Pal Gurjar, Union Minister of State, and the Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Faridabad.

- ❑ The BBA Department also organized a Stock Market Mock Trading Session for the benefit of the students. The said session was conducted by a team from Profit Idea, Gurugram.

ADMISSION RULES

1. Candidates seeking admission must fulfil the eligibility conditions of that particular class. The college will not be responsible if the admission of any student is not confirmed by M.D. University, Rohtak. The M.D. University rules regarding admissions will be applicable to students and if any change is made by the university at any stage in the said rules, it will be binding on the students. **All admission are provisional, subject to approval by M.D. University, Rohtak. THE PRINCIPAL RESERVES THE RIGHT NOT TO GRANT ADMISSION TO ANY STUDENT WITHOUT ASSIGNING ANY REASON IN THE INTEREST OF THE DISCIPLINE OF THE COLLEGE.**
2. **The SC Candidates of Haryana shall be granted reduction/relaxation of 5% marks in the eligibility conditions in all the courses in the marks required for general category. The said reduction will be calculated as per the example given below:**
As per Govt. Instructions, in a course where a general candidate requires to have 50% marks by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a SC/ST candidate should be calculated as under:-
Out of 100 Marks needs to less=5
Out of 1 Marks needs to less=5/100
Out of 50 Marks needs to less=5/100×50=2.50
This way, minimum less mark where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidate will be 50-2.50=47.50 and not 45.
3. Students from the Board of School Education, Haryana, or other Boards and Universities recognized by M.D. University can be admitted to the class for which they are eligible under rules if they satisfy the conditions laid down by the University regarding their eligibility and admission.

NOTE:

If a candidate of another Board did not pass in the subject of English at 10+2 level, he/she may be allowed provisionally to join the B.A. / B.Com. Sem-I class as the case may be under new scheme of this University, subject to his/her qualifying in the subject of English of 10+2 examination at the supplementary examination of the same year or in the next annual exam. held in March from the Board concerned. Such a candidate shall have to furnish to the University proof of his/her having cleared the subject of English before the declaration of the result of B.A./B.Com. Sem-II examination failing which his/her result of B.A./B.Com. Sem-I & II examination shall stand automatically cancelled.

4. THE FOLLOWING CATEGORIES OF STUDENTS ARE NOT TO BE ADMITTED:

- (i) Candidates, who have been placed under compartment in the Class XII Examination of the Board of School Education, Haryana, or any other Board or any other examination recognised by the university as equivalent thereto, in the 1st year of any undergraduate or postgraduate degree programme.
- (ii) Candidates who have failed in a university examination are not to be readmitted. Such candidates may reappear in the examination as ex-students.
- (iii) Candidates who have been detained or absented themselves from the University Examinations for two years in the same class.
- (iv) Students who have an inexcusable break in their studies.
- (v) Students who indulged in undesirable activities/gross misconduct during the previous session in any other college or in this college.

5. Students from other Boards/Universities seeking admission to this college will have to produce at the time of interview original certificates of all the examinations passed prior to the class which they intend to join, original Inter-University/ Board Migration Certificate, Character Certificate and School/ College Leaving Certificate from the Principal of the institution last attended and the Detailed Marks Card/ Certificate of the qualifying examination. However, if they are admitted provisionally in the absence of any of the above documents, they will have to deposit all the original certificates along with two sets of the photocopies thereof with the college office latest by 10th August, failing which they will themselves be responsible for the consequences including the possible cancellation of their admission.

In case a candidate is not able to submit the migration certificate when his registration is sent to the university, the migration of such candidates will subsequently be forwarded in original to the Registration and Scholarship Branch of the University as per the schedule and the late fee mentioned below.

All U.G. Courses

- i) Upto 30th November - With late fee of Rs. 500/-
- ii) Upto 31st January - With late fee of Rs. 1000/-
- iii) Upto 31st March - With late fee of Rs. 2000/-

NOTE:

- (a) The University Roll Numbers will not be given to the students unless they are registered with M.D. University through the college office.
- (b) The students are advised to keep with themselves a photocopy of any documents submitted to the college office at the time of admission or later during the year.

6. RULES FOR CANDIDATES PLACED IN COMPARTMENT

The candidates admitted to B.A./ B.Com. Pass Course will be allowed compartment and the chances for clearing compartment as per the relevant university rules.

7. PROMOTION UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

Common Clause for all courses

- (i) The candidate will be allowed to appear in the examination if he/she meets the following requirements :
 - a) bears a good character
 - b) has been on the rolls of department during the semester/year.
 - c) has attended not less than 65% of Lectures delivered in theory as well as practical.
- (ii) It has been decided by the University that the students who were admitted in 1st semester in the Session 2016-17 will be promoted to the next semesters according to the provision stated below:

A student who has passed atleast 50% papers of 1st semester shall be promoted to 3rd semester, a student who has passed all the papers of 1st semester shall be promoted to 5th semester and a student who has passed the 1st Module i.e. Semester 1st to 6th will be promoted to the 7th semester.

Students to the other semesters will be promoted automatically.

Further, the students who have taken admission in 1st semester in any course prior to session 2016-17, all such students will be promoted automatically irrespective of passing the papers of 1st /3rd/ 5th semester unless otherwise specified in any other Ordinance.

8. RE-ADMISSION IN CASE THE NAME IS STRUCK OFF BECAUSE OF CONTINUOUS ABSENCE FROM COLLEGE WITHOUT ANY INFORMATION

The name of the students remaining absent for 15 consecutive days after the start or during the academic session without any notice shall be struck off from the rolls of the Institute. A fine of Rs. 5/- per lecture/day shall be charged on account of remaining absent from the classes.

However, re-admission may be allowed on payment of Rs. 1000/- alongwith the required fine within 15 days with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor. If a student fails to report within this time limit, the seat will be declared vacant to be

filled according to the university rules. Re-admission may be allowed by the Vice-Chancellor only once on the recommendation of the Principal on payment of the prescribed re-admission fee.

9. INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING UNIVERSITY EXAMS

The students are directed to consult the University Website for all information related to their university examinations and not depend solely upon the college to provide such information to them. As directed by the University, It is their responsibility to get all such information themselves from the MD University website www.mdurohtak.com.

10. INSTRUCTIONS FOR S.C./ B.C. CANDIDATES

All the Scheduled Caste/ Backward Class candidates seeking admission to any class are directed to submit a certificate/ an affidavit in respect of income as well as another certificate by way of proof of caste/ class at the time of admission. The college is duty-bound to take such certificates from the candidates belonging to the above categories, in keeping with the commitment to this effect given by it to the Office of the Director General, Higher Education, Haryana.

11. RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of seats, in view of Reservation Policy issued by Govt. of Haryana vide Notification No. 22/10/2013-IGSIII dated 28.2.2013 and instructions received from time to time in various programmes offered in Govt./Govt. aided educational/technical/professional institution is as detailed below:

Note: The reservation of seats is as per Reservation Policy of the State Govt. of Haryana and is subject to change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.

In the event of the quota reserved for physically handicapped candidates remaining unutilized due to non-availability of suitable category of handicapped candidates, it may be offered to Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%). Further 3% reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General Category, 1% out of Scheduled Caste and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission.

As far as Block allocation in Block-A and Block-B of Backward Classes Category is concerned, year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block-A of Backward classes are given seats in academic year 2013, the next Block i.e. Block-B of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2014 and so on.

Moreover, one Sports seat in each course (over and above the sanctioned intake) where the sanctioned intake is 30 seats and two seats where the sanctioned intake is more than 30 have been earmarked for outstanding sportsperson(s) in B.A./B.Com. and all other U.G. Courses/ P.G. Courses subject to the fulfilment of certain conditions laid down by the university.

Two additional seats in each course on offer shall be earmarked for Kashmiri migrants. Admission against these seats shall be made on the basis of the merit of the qualifying examination.

One supernumerary seat in each college will be earmarked to promote cultural activities, subject to the fulfilment of certain conditions laid down by the University.

NOTE:

The Principal has full powers and unfettered discretion in all matters pertaining to internal administration of the college, such as:

- (a) Admission.**
- (b) Promotion and detention of students.**
- (c) Disciplinary action and imposition of penalties.**

FOREIGN STUDENTS

The admission of foreign students to the college will be governed by M. D. University rules.

RULES FOR WITHDRAWAL

Withdrawal from the college after getting admission will be allowed by the Principal on receipt of an application to that effect from the student concerned, duly endorsed by his father or guardian. A student who applies to the Principal for leaving the college during the session will have to pay the fee and other dues for the whole session. Refund of fee, if any, will be as per M.D. University rules. No student will be permitted to leave the college until he/she has cleared all dues.

LIBRARY

The college has a very well-stocked, well-furnished and fully computerised Central Library Complex with an impressive numbers of reference books and OPAC and INFLIBNET facility. The Library subscribes to a good number of journals, magazines and newspapers. It has a well-stocked Book Bank as well.

Note : The students of the Final Year of B.A. / B.Com. Degree Program, who do not return the library books issued against their names till 30th June of the academic session, will be charged fine after the expiry of that period. And if they do not return the books even by 31st Oct. of the next session, their college security will be forfeited against the cost of the books.

IDENTITY-CUM-LIBRARY CARD

A student who is admitted to the college gets his/her Identity-cum-Library Card within 7-10 days of depositing the fee. The card is issued from the Library and cannot be used by any other person. It is mandatory for a student to keep his/her Identity Card with him/her on the campus and produce it on demand by a staff member. In case the card is lost, the Librarian should be immediately informed about it. In such a case, a student will get a new Identity Card only on production of a copy of the FIR registered with the police and payment of Rs. 100/-

Students who have passed B.A. Part-I Examination of this University or any other examination recognised by this University as equivalent thereto are eligible to join B.A. Part-II Comprising Third and Fourth Semesters. Every student shall normally offer the same subjects as he/she had offered in B.A. Part-I.

c) B.A. Part-III (*Three Year Degree Course*)

Students who have passed B.A. Part-II Examination of this University or any other examination recognized by this University as equivalent thereto are eligible to join B.A. Part-III comprising Fifth and Sixth Semesters. Every student shall offer the same subjects as he/she had offered in B.A. Part-II.

ADD ON COURSES

The students of BA and B.Com. can also opt for job-oriented Add On Courses, namely Computer Graphics, Animation Multimedia and Web Designing, Oracle 9: DBA and Computer Hardware Networking and Ethical Hacking along with their regular Degree Programme by paying an additional fee of Rs. 6,000/- per annum at the time of admission. Upon successful completion of the first year of an Add On Course, they will get a certificate from M.D. University, Rohtak. Upon completion of the second year, they will be awarded a diploma and upon completion of the third year, they will be awarded a degree. However, an Add On Course will be run only if the minimum number of students opting for it is atleast 30.

NOTE:

- a) Students to please note that admission to a particular subject in the 1st year of the B.A./B.Com. Course (unless the seats have been fixed by the University) will be made only if the number of students joining the particular subject is in keeping with the Office of the Director General of Higher Education / M.D. University, Rohtak, norms.

Even if a student has been admitted to a particular subject, he/she will have to change the subject or faculty or migrate to some other college if the number

of students in that subject does not meet the present Office of the Director General of Higher Education / M.D. University, Rohtak, norm of atleast 30 students in each class.

- b) Students from non-Hindi speaking areas and foreign students are allowed the option to offer the subject of Additional English in lieu of Compulsory Hindi.
- c) The duration of each period/lecture will be 45 minutes.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

For the students of all the three years of both the undergraduate courses, there shall be 20 marks or 20% marks for internal evaluation based upon attendance, Class Tests and Assignments in each theory paper as per the Scheme of Internal Assessment and weightage formulas decided upon by M.D. University, Rohtak.

CHANGE OF SUBJECT OR FACULTY

Change of subject or faculty may be allowed to T.D.C. Part-I(Sem-I) students at the discretion of the Principal only if a seat is available.

A student of T.D.C Part-I (Sem-I) may be permitted to change his/her faculty or subject(s) within one month from the commencement of the session or within one month from the date of joining whichever is later. However, in a genuine case such as parents' transfer, or a student coming from abroad, this rule may be relaxed on the recommendation of the Principal and the change- over from one subject to another may be allowed upto the end of the first term at the risk and responsibility of the student himself/herself.

ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES PAPER

The subject of Environmental Studies has been included as a qualifying paper by the university in all Under Graduate Courses and the students will be required to qualify the same, otherwise the final result will not be declared and degree will not be awarded.

The examination in respect of the above paper in the case of B.A./B.Com. (Pass Course) will be conducted by the College.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS, CLASS TESTS & ASSIGNMENTS

- a) Only such students will be permitted to appear in the University Examination as fulfil the conditions specified under Special Regulations for University Examinations.
- b) **A student shall not be eligible to appear in the University Examination unless he/she has attended at least 65% of the full course of lectures delivered to his/her class in each of the subjects and fulfilled his/ her eligibility pertaining to Class Tests and Assignments.**
- c) **Students using unfair means in the Class Tests/University Examinations shall be strictly dealt with. All the concessions in fee etc. granted to such students shall be withdrawn. In serious cases the action may amount to heavy fine, expulsion from the college or rustication.**
- d) **Students who do not appear in a Class Test owing to any reason except that of illness shall be deemed to have secured zero marks in the paper(s) concerned and their fee concession will be withdrawn. In case of illness during the examination days, the students concerned will have to produce a medical certificate issued by an M.B.B.S. doctor.**
- e) **Student absenting themselves from Class Tests without leave shall be penalised as per the decision of the Examination Committee since it is compulsory for all the students to take Class Tests.**

RELIGIOUS AND MORAL EDUCATION

Joining the NCC brightens career prospects by facilitating entry into the armed forces and also gives one an opportunity to safeguard the frontiers and the freedom of the country. Every year a Boy and a Girl are adjudged the Best NCC Cadets by the college and honoured at the Annual Prize Distribution Function.

N.S.S.

To inculcate a sense of social responsibility, promote social activism and inspire our students to live up to the motto "*Service Before Self*", the **National Service Scheme Boys' Unit of the college is rendering yeoman's service. Every year a student is adjudged the Best N.S.S. Volunteer by the college and honoured at the Prize Distribution Function. With effect from the academic session 2014-15, the NSS Girls' Unit has also come into being and put up a fine example of national service during a short span.**

SPORTS

For the wholesome growth and fine-tuning of their personality, students are exhorted to take active part in various games and field events. Talented and committed sportspersons are encouraged even to make a career out of sports. **The College has in place a scheme of liberal scholarships and grants for promising sportspersons who have made a mark in sports.** Students should please note that the matter of the grant of these scholarships and stipends and the quantum thereof will be decided by a duly constituted Sports Committee on the basis of carefully and rationally worked out criteria.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Various Subject Societies, Associations, Clubs and Fora have carried out diverse extracurricular activities over the years, giving the students an excellent opportunity to hone their talent and genius and fine-tune their personality.

Upon getting admission, all the students shall become members of one Subject Society (from Sr. No.1 to 5) and one Association/Club/Society (from Sr. No. 6 to 15) as mentioned under the heading 'Assignments.'

It is compulsory for all girl students to become members of the Women's Cell. Only such students can apply for nomination to the office of a Society as have attended at least 65% lectures upto the date of application for such nomination.

Extramural activities of a high standard are the norm in our college. Our talented and committed EMA students are not only a force to reckon with in Zonal and Inter-Zonal Youth Festivals of the University but also regularly win accolades at the All India Inter-University Youth Festivals as well as at other State, National and even International Level Cultural Events.

MAGAZINES

The College brings out its in-house magazine *Shatabdi Pratigya* with a view to promoting the habit of good purposeful writing among students as well as a record of the goings-on and developments in the college during the year. LIBRARY KNOWLEDGE GROUP

Previously the College Career Counselling-cum-Placement Cell, in collaboration with the Rastriya Chetnashakti Foundation, an NGO, was providing coaching for competitive exams to our students. Now the college has formed a Library Knowledge Group, again in collaboration with the above Foundation, which selects promising students to coach them for various competitive exams in batches of 40. A written test and interview for selecting a batch of 40 such students will be held in the first week of August. The coaching will be provided by the best possible experts available in different fields of study.

PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The college is running a Personality Development Programme for the students of the college. A highly qualified and competent guest faculty has been involved in this programme so as to groom our students' overall personality and substantially improve their communication skills so that they can meet the challenges of the present day competitive world with confidence, elan and poise and succeed in their chosen fields. Plans are afoot to not only continue this extracurricular programme but also to strengthen it during the coming years.

CAREER COUNSELLING-CUM-PLACEMENT CELL

The college has in place a Career Counselling-cum-Placement Cell which effectively helps the students make the right career choices. The Cell also strives to ensure that the maximum number of students get good jobs and career openings upon passing out from the college.

WOMEN'S CELL

The Women's Cell set up under the auspices of the National Commission for Women and as per the directive of the Office of the Director General of Higher Education, Haryana, is very active. Over the years it has organised successful Legal Literacy Campaigns for college and school girls, State Level Workshops, seminars, discussions, debates, talks and inter-college declamation contests on women's issues and has a number of ambitious programmes lined up for the future.

LEGAL LITERACY CELL

The College has a Legal Literacy Cell which is very active in the matter of spreading legal awareness among the students and the staff. It not only organises different events like debates, declamations, poetic recitation, essay writing and poster making etc., focusing on the legal aspect of important socio-political and other issues, at the college level but also sends our students to participate in all such events held under the auspices of the Haryana State Legal Services Authority and the Directorate General, Higher Education, Haryana, at the district, divisional and state level where the participants from our college have done exceedingly well over the years.

STIPENDS & SCHOLARSHIPS

A number of charitable organisations like the R.K.M. Trust, Prerna Dham, Faridabad, and the Sita Ram Jindal Foundation, New Delhi, offer liberal assistance to deserving students in the form of stipends, subsidies and scholarships. The D.A.V. College Managing Committee,

New Delhi, has instituted one Smt. Lajwanti Maharaj Singh Scholarship on a yearly basis which is awarded to a poor and deserving student of this college @ Rs. 200/- per month. ***Several government agencies and departments like the Office of the Director General of Higher Education, Haryana, and the State Social Welfare Dept. etc., also render financial help on a regular basis to our SC/ BC, physically disabled and meritorious students. The university also grants scholarships to deserving students from the college out of Radhakrishnan Fund.***

Note:The SC/ST/OBC/PwD(Persons with Disabilities) students eligible for government scholarship are directed to submit their scholarship forms for the Academic Year 2017-18 by February, 2017, for the purpose of processing their scholarship.

AWARDS AND PRIZES

A boy and a girl from among the final year students will be given the Best Boy Student and the Best Girl Student Award as well as College Colour conferred on them on the basis of their overall performance in the college including their score in the preceding University Examination. College Colour will also be conferred upon students who top in University Examinations.

Students, who secure any position between 1st and 15th in the Merit Lists of the University Semester Exams, will be given prizes at the Annual Prize Distribution Function. Prizes are also given for singular and outstanding achievements in sports and other co-curricular activities. Also the college gives away to outstanding students, who secure first, second or third position in academics at the university level, special trophies / medals from its own resources.

FINE FOR LATE PAYMENT OF FEE

If fee is not paid on the fixed dates notified by the college, an additional fine for late payment of the college fee will be charged at the rate of Rs. 10/- per day subject to a maximum fine of Rs. 100/-. After 10 days the name of the student concerned shall be struck off the college rolls. Clearance of arrears of Fee and payment of Readmission Fee will be required for readmission which will be given at the discretion of the Principal.

FEE CONCESSION, SCHOLARSHIPS & OTHER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The college grants fee concession to financially hard-up but deserving students. Brilliant students are also given suitable incentives and concessions by the college. Applications for Merit and Merit-cum-Means Concessions will be invited in due course about which the students will be duly notified.

In the college there is provision for Students' Aid Fund from which money can be given to poor and deserving students for purchasing books, meeting their expenses on Tuition Fee and University Fee and for other needs. Help can be rendered to poor students from the Red Cross Fund also.

Financial assistance is available for the students under the various schemes of the Govt.

of India and the Govt. of Haryana like The Post Matric Scholarship Scheme of the Govt. of India (only for students belonging to Scheduled Castes / Backward Classes/ Minorities) and the State Merit Scholarship Scheme of the Govt. of Haryana. Interested students should contact the college office for details regarding the above schemes, the prescribed application forms thereof and the last date for applying for the scholarship on offer.

QUARTERLY BUS PASS

1. Applications for concessional Bus Passes will be entertained only in the months of July, October, January and April. Charges for a minimum of three months' period will have to be paid by the interested students by the 5th of the above months. The charges will be as per Haryana Roadways rules.
2. The students are required to return the Passes before leaving the college.

RAIL CONCESSION

Such concession is permissible only to outstation students for travelling to and from their hometowns during vacation period. The relevant address mentioned in the Admission Form will be the basis of consideration for the purpose. Daily commuters shall apply for railway concession within a week from the beginning of each term of the academic session.

NOTE:

In case of loss of Bus/Rail Pass, an FIR will have to be lodged and a copy of the same submitted for getting a new Pass issued. In case renewal of a Pass is sought, the old Pass will have to be submitted and deposited for the purpose.

CYCLE/SCOOTER/BIKE PARKING FEE

Interested students will be charged the Cycle/Scooter/Bike Parking Fee for parking their vehicles in the Parking Stand inside the Campus for the entire session unless allowed otherwise in mid-session. If any student parks his/her vehicle without locking it properly, the college will not be responsible for any resultant loss.

BAN ON RAGGING IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

Ragging in educational institutions is banned and any one indulging in ragging is likely to be punished appropriately. The punishment may include expulsion/suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology. The punishment may also take shape of (i) withholding or withdrawing scholarships or fellowships and other benefits (ii) forfeiting campus placement

opportunities or recommendations. (iii) debarring from appearing in any test or examination or other evaluation process (iv) debarring from representing the educational institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc. (v) withholding results (vi) suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess (vii) cancellation of admission (viii) lodging of FIR with the local police. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not/cannot be identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other students, indulging in rowdy or indisplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear apprehension thereof in freshers or junior students or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely effect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student or any type of abuse through electronic media or wrongful confinement, use of criminal force, assault as well as sexual offence, trespass, defamation or threat to defame will be deemed an act of ragging.

Hon^{ble} Supreme Court of India in SPL (C) No. 24295/2004 in the matter of University of Kerala V/s Council of Principals, Colleges of Kerala and others has ordered that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain to if his/ her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him/her from the Institution.

- 6) The primary aim of the Arya Samaj is to do good to all i.e. promote their physical, spiritual and social well-being.
- 7) We should treat all people with love, fairness and due regard for their merit.
- 8) We should aim at dispelling ignorance and promoting knowledge.
- 9) One should not only be content with one's own welfare, but should also look for contentment in the welfare of others.
- 10). One should regard oneself under restriction to follow the altruistic rulings of society. While following rules of individual welfare, all should be free.
